ABOUT THE FACILITY

Stafford Creek Corrections Center (SCCC) is a 1,936-bed multi-custody facility on a 210-acre site. Construction started in July 1998 and the facility opened April 3, 2000. SCCC is one of the newest construction of prisons in Washington State.

SCCC structures its operations and programs around practices that show sustainable reductions in incarcerated individuals returning to prison while also enhancing security for the facility and safety for communities across Washington.

PROGRAMMING

Programs are designed to provide incarcerated individuals with resources and opportunities to learn positive skills that ultimately reduce risk to the community. Individuals who participate in programs are better equipped to make a more successful transition back into the community and to make better choices upon release.

Amend:

- SCCC has adopted the Amend project from Norway. The principles of Amend are Normalization, Dynamic Security and Progression. The Amend program encourages staff and incarcerated individuals to have positive professional communication and to work together for a more humane environment inside facilities in Washington State

EDUCATION

Education classes are provided by Grays Harbor College through an interagency agreement between DOC and the State Board of Community and Technical Colleges to provide educational services to the incarcerated individuals. State law requires that all incarcerated individuals who do not have a verifiable High School Diploma or GED and test lower than the 8th grade level, be enrolled in a basic skills program.
