PRC is located in Kitsap County and within the city limits of Port Orchard. The facility is part of an industrial area with several locally established businesses. PRC was constructed in 1995 and became operational in 1996. The primary goal is to improve public safety by positively changing lives, reconnecting with family and providing residents with the knowledge and skills necessary for success in the community.

Residents who meet the screening criteria may be transferred to PRC 12 months before their earliest release date. The facility is operated by the Washington State Department of Corrections and provides 24/7 safety and security, food services, case management and maintenance. The Department of Corrections owns the building.
