- Mr. Harig was seen for a .100 hearing on March 22, 2018 at the Coyote Ridge Correction Center.
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Mr. Patnode presented this case.

Mr. Harig is under the jurisdiction of the Indeterminate Sentence Review Board for Vehicular Homicide in Pierce County Cause 47958.

The crime involved Mr. Harig and a friend driving to a party on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July in 1975. They both had ingested several alcoholic beverages and Mr. Harig was driving fast and irresponsibly. His friend asked him to light a cigarette and when he leaned over to do that, he lost control of the car resulting in the crash that killed his friend. He was 19 years of age at the time and is currently 61 years of age.

Mr. Harig received a deferred sentence, but absconded out of state where he committed another offense and spent 32 years in custody. Once that sentence was complete he was returned to Washington State, his deferred sentence was revoked, and he was sentenced to serve out his sentence. He has life time supervision in South Carolina.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a low to moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Harig has had no infractions during his incarceration.

Mr. Harig says he completed significant programming in South Carolina and has completed several technical and vocational courses in Washington.

He has great community support and owns his own home in South Carolina. He has a job interview in South Carolina when he is released.

- **Recommendation:** The panel finds Mr. Harig conditionally parolable. The Board would like him to go to camp.
- **Next Action:** Schedule .100 120 days prior to parole eligibility review date (PERD).
