**DECISION AND REASONS**

This matter came before Kecia Rongen and Jeff Patnode, who are members of the Indeterminate Sentence Review Board (ISRB or the Board) on the above date for a release hearing in accordance with the provisions of RCW 9.95.100. Mr. Alishio appeared in person and was represented by attorney Richard Linn. Testimony was provided by Department of Corrections (DOC) Classification Counselor (CC) Frederick Rogers and Mr. Alishio.

**BOARD DECISION:**

Based on the requirements of RCW 9.95.009(3) and RCW 9.95.100 and the totality of evidence and information considered by the Board, the Board finds that Mr. Alishio is conditionally parolable to a MRP and adds 24 months to his minimum term.

**NEXT ACTION:**

Schedule a .100 hearing 120 days prior to his PERD.

**JURISDICTION:**

Edward Alishio is under the jurisdiction of the Board on an October 21, 1980, conviction in King County Cause #80-1-02215-2 for Count I - Rape in the First Degree While Armed with a Deadly Weapon (WAWADW). The time start is January 20, 1981. The minimum term was set at 169 months from a SRA (Sentencing Reform Act) adjusted range of 90 to 114 months. The maximum term is Life. Mr. Alishio has served approximately 36 years and five months in prison and zero days of jail time (101 days of Phelan credit were applied in the adjusted sentencing range). It should be noted that Mr. Alishio was also convicted under this cause number on Count III - Rape in the Second Degree to run concurrently with Count I. Count III had a ten year maximum term that expired in 1990.

**NATURE OF INDEX OFFENSE(S):**

According to file materials regarding Count I, on June 7, 1980, Mr. Alishio, at his age of 25, raped an unknown 32 year old female after he provided roadside assistance when her vehicle ran out of gas. Mr. Alishio initially asked the female to accompany him to get gas for her car, but she refused. When he returned with the gas, Mr. Alishio leaned into the victim's car while armed with a knife and told her, "This is a rape." He attempted to penetrate the victim's vagina, but was unsuccessful, but proceeded to masturbate and ejaculate on the victim. He left the victim in her car and took the knife and the victim's wallet with him, accidentally leaving his own wallet in her vehicle. Mr. Alishio was arrested on June 10, 1980, on this count; however, he was released on June 12, 1980, on his personal recognizance.

In regards to Count III, file materials indicate that on July 13, 1980, Mr. Alishio raped an unknown 29 year old woman who had been walking on a main highway. Mr. Alishio offered the woman a ride and she accepted. After asking if the victim "wanted sex" and she declined, Mr. Alishio grabbed the victim by her hair and threatened to kill her if she did not engage in sex with him. Mr. Alishio was unable to vaginally rape the victim and digitally penetrated her anus. The victim reported the rape immediately afterwards and was able to provide police with Mr. Alishio's name and the license number of his vehicle.

**PRIOR CRIMINAL CONDUCT:**

Mr. Alishio has a lengthy criminal history that began when he was age 11. As a juvenile he had a number of sexually deviant convictions to include Indecent Liberties at age 14 and Attempted Rape at age 15, which resulted in his commitment to the Child Study and Treatment Center at Western State Hospital (WSH) in 1970. He was also arrested for Exposing at age 17. Mr. Alishio was convicted of a sexually motivated Assault Second Degree at age 18, for which he was committed to the Sexual Psychopathy Program at WSH, which he did not successfully complete. This offense involved an attempted rape and abduction at gunpoint. File materials note that this was a reduction from an Attempted Rape. A 1980 report described Mr. Alishio as a “very compulsive sadistically-oriented rapist.”

**HISTORY/COMMENTS:**

Mr. Alishio's was last seen by the Board on June 7, 2016 and was found not releasable, 18 months were added to his minimum term. This was due to Mr. Alishio being referred for a Forensic Psychological Evaluation (FPE) for 71.09 and allowing time for that to be completed. Previous to that hearing, Mr. Alishio had been see June 2, 2015 and was found conditionally parolable to a Mutual Re-Entry Program (MRP).

Mr. Alishio continues to do well in prison, he has not had any infractions and works as a unit porter. Mr. Alishio would like to go to the Crossroads program at MSU if the Board again finds him conditionally parolable.

Mr. Alishio indicated that he didn't have any problems going through the FPE evaluation and was pleased with the outcome. He appeared open and honest about his criminal history. Mr. Alishio currently walks with a cane due to medical issues. He is also on a number of medications which he plans to continue if he is released. Mr. Alishio expressed appreciation for his SOTAP primary therapist, Ms. Joan Howe as he felt she was sincere in wanting to help him and held him accountable.

The FPE was completed by Dr. Amy Phenix. Dr. Phenix noted that she did not have “sufficient evidence to consider that Mr. Alishio continues to suffer from a paraphilic disorder.” She went on to note that this is due to the length of time since his last sex offense and reduction in libido due to Mr. Alishio’s age. Dr. Phenix assessed Mr. Alishio’s risk with the Static-99R and the Static-2002R as average to above-average, however she also indicated that “the associated absolute probabilities are quite low.” Dr. Phenix did not find Mr. Alishio to meet criteria as a sexually violent predator due to his age, his successful treatment compliance and the supervision requirement upon his release.

**INFORMATION CONSIDERED:**

In preparation for Mr. Alishio’s hearing and its decision in this case, the Board completed a review of his ISRB file. The Board considered all information contained in that file, including but not limited to: the most recent DOC facility plan; information regarding institutional behavior and programming; any letters of support and/or concerns sent to the Board; the Pre-Sentence Investigation report; psychological evaluation prepared by Dr. Deborah Wentworth. The Board also considered the testimony of the witnesses listed above.

The original recommendation from the Judge was Life.

**REASONS:**

**This was a deferred decision following a full Board discussion using a structured decision-making framework that takes into consideration; the statistical estimate of risk, criminal history, parole/release history, ability to control behavior, responsivity to programming, demonstrated offender change, release planning, discordant information, and other case specific factors. Based on the requirements of RCW 9.95.009 (3) and RCW 9.95.100 the Board finds Mr. Alishio conditionally parolable.**

Mr. Alishio has now served over 36 years in prison, well over the SRA range of 90 to 114 months and term set by the Board at 169 months. Due to Mr. Alishio’s criminal history and treatment

needs this term was warranted. However, he has completed sexual deviancy treatment twice, chemical dependency treatment, participated in mental health treatment and has not had any serious infractions since 2010. He recently received a psychological evaluation that rates his overall risk as low-medium. Mr. Alishio also is over the age of 60 and has medical conditions which impact his mobility. The Board would like Mr. Alishio to go to a camp, perhaps MSU to attend Crossroads. He likely would not be accepted into work release due to his criminal history, therefore Board will see him while he is camp. His rehabilitation is positive and it appears as if he is on his way to release to the community. Mr. Alishio should continue to work on his release plan and community support.
