- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.

- Mr. Bingham was seen for a .100 Hearing on June 6, 2017 at the Monroe Correctional Command – Twin Rivers Unit.

- **Summary Discussion**
Mr. Patnode presented this case.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a high risk to re-offend.

Mr. Bingham is under the Board's jurisdiction in Clallam County Cause 6295 for Murder in the Second Degree.

File materials describe Mr. Bingham raping and strangling to death an unknown developmentally disabled 26 year old woman he had just met on a public bus. The victim had a mental age of eight to nine years old.

Mr. Bingham was 25 years old at the time of the rape and murder and he is currently 60 years of age.

Mr. Bingham was paroled from the Murder in the Second Degree on April 29, 2010. His parole was revoked on May 31, 2011 for the stalking and harassing of two women in his AA Group. He continues to have very little insight into his violation behavior.

Mr. Bingham has committed a total of 15 serious infractions and none since his return in 2011 on a parole violation.

Mr. Bingham completed six months in the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) Aftercare and did poorly. He did complete SOTAP and other programming but did not do well.

Mr. Bingham has community support people in Snohomish County that he knows from prison.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends finding Mr. Bingham not releasable and adding 60 months to the minimum term. Schedule .100 120 days prior to PERD.
