- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.

- Mr. Aguilar was seen for a .100 Hearing on July 19, 2017 at the Coyote Ridge Corrections Center.

- **Summary Discussion**
Ms. Balmert presented this case.

Mr. Aguilar is under the Board's jurisdiction in King County Cause 93-1-03001-7 for Murder in the Second Degree.

The crime involved the 1977 murder of a 24 year old male whose body was found in his apartment with several stab wounds. The case remained unsolved for 15 years. However, in January of 1993 Seattle Police were contacted by staff from a correctional facility in Texas where Mr. Aguilar was incarcerated. Mr. Aguilar wanted to confess to the 1977 murder because he

had become a Christian. Mr. Aguilar was 23 years old at the time of the crime and he is currently 63 years of age.

Mr. Aguilar has the following previous convictions:

- October 30, 1970 – Aggravated Battery and Resisting in Chicago, Illinois. He was sentenced to supervision.
- September 30, 1971 – Aggravated Battery and Resisting in Chicago, Illinois. He was sentenced to supervision.
- September 18, 1975 – Robbery in Snohomish County, Washington. He was sentenced to three years and was on escape from work release for this conviction when he committed the King County Murder.
- September 16, 1977 – Armed Robbery in Oneida County, Idaho. He was sentenced to 12 years. Committed when on escape from work release for the Snohomish County Robbery.
- November 15, 1977 – Escape in the First Degree in King County Cause 72504 – He received 10 years confinement.
- January 29, 1981 – Aggravated Battery, Ada County, Idaho. He received 15 years confinement.
- April 15, 1986 – Aggravated Robbery with a Deadly Weapon in Tom Green County, Texas. He was sentenced to 45 years confinement. He was serving on this conviction when he admitted to the King County Murder.
- February 18, 1987 - Murder in the Second Degree, Larceny and Taking a Motor Vehicle with Habitual Criminal Finding in Santa Fe, New Mexico. He was sentenced to 19 years of confinement to run concurrently with the Texas conviction.

There are no current risk assessments in the file that rate his risk to re-offend.

Mr. Aguilar's last infractions was in 2009 for THC.

Mr. Aguilar has completed the Therapeutic Community Program but has been unable to participate in Thinking for a Change due to his ICE Detainer. He has completed his AA Degree and other educational programs.

Mr. Aguilar has parole obligations on his Texas sentence until January 6, 2031. However, he also has an ICE Detainer to Mexico. His support is in Washington State.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends finding him not parolable and extends him to his maximum expiration date of May 28, 2029. Next action is to schedule a Cashaw Hearing.
