- Mr. Forrest was seen for a .100 Hearing on July 18, 2017 at the Washington State Penitentiary.
- **Summary Discussion**  
Ms. Rongen presented this case.

Mr. Forrest is under the Board's jurisdiction in Clark County Cause 10264 for Murder in the First Degree.

The crime involved Mr. Forrest giving a ride to the 19 year old victim whose remains were later found in a shallow grave in a Clark County Parks Maintenance Depot which was secured by a series of locked gates. It was discovered that the only employee with access to the maintenance depot with a vehicle matching the description of the one the victim was last seen entering was Mr. Forrest. He admitted that he drove her to his place of work

at the Tukes Mountain Park, attempted to rape her and then stabbed her to death because she struggled. He was 25 years old at the time the crime was committed and he is currently 68 years of age.

Mr. Forrest was previously charged with Assault in the First Degree, Rape and Armed Robbery in Clark County Cause #8541 in 1974 and was found not guilty by reason of insanity and sent to Western State Hospital. He was in custody at Western State Hospital when the index Murder charges were filed.

During the same time period as the other crimes, Mr. Forrest lured a 20 year old female into his vehicle telling her he was a college student doing a photography project and he wanted her to model for him. He assaulted and attempted to rape her and left her in the bound in the woods telling her he would return. She was able to escape. Mr. Forrest was charged with this crime but the charges did not result in a conviction.

Mr. Forrest is also suspected of five additional cases of murder, but law enforcement lack sufficient evidence to charge him.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a moderate risk to re-offend.

Infractions: Mr. Forrest has three serious infractions with the last one occurring in 1993.

Mr. Forrest completed the Sex Offender Treatment and Assessment Program (SOTAP) and Making it Work. Progress in SOTAP is minimal because he refuses to talk about uncharged crimes, therefore his risk is unknown.

Mr. Forrest would like to transition to lower levels of custody.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends he be found not parolable and adds 90 months to his minimum term. Schedule .100 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date (PERD).
