- An updated Prosecutor recommendation was not received.

- Mr. Wilson was seen for a .100 Hearing on July 18, 2017 at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Special Offender Unit.

- **Summary Discussion**
Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented this case.

Mr. Wilson is under the Board's jurisdiction in King County Cause 83-1-01569-0 for Rape in the First Degree and Robbery in the First Degree. He has previous convictions on this cause for two counts of Rape in the First Degree.

The crimes involved Mr. Wilson and an accomplice entering a hotel room occupied by a 16 year old female and six friends. They demanded money from everyone, two of the friends were allowed to leave and the remaining four were locked in the hotel bathroom by the accomplice who threatened to beat them with brass knuckles. Mr. Wilson then forcibly raped the 16 year old female. Mr. Wilson was 19 years of age at the time of the crime and is currently 51 years of age.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a high risk to re-offend.

Mr. Wilson has had two serious infractions since his last hearing and has a problem with leering at female staff.

Mr. Wilson is not medically compliant and has completed very little actual programming over the years. The Board would like him to start participating in appropriate groups while in the Special Offender Unit at Monroe to include the anxiety group.

Mr. Wilson does not have a release plan, and at this point the Board does not see him being able to converse with a Community Corrections Officer or follow direction.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends finding him not parolable and extends him to his maximum term. Schedule a Cashaw Hearing in November 2022.
