- An updated prosecutor recommendation was received February 26, 2016 which “opposed any reduction in Mr. Paddyaker’s sentence.”
- Mr. Paddyaker was seen for a Release Hearing on June 25, 2017 at the Airway Heights Corrections Center.
- **Summary Discussion**  
Mr. Patnode presented this case.

Mr. Paddyaker is being seen by the Board in Spokane County Cause 92-1-01638-0 for Conspiracy – Robbery in the First Degree and Murder in the First Degree.

The crimes involved Mr. Paddyaker, along with co-defendants, creating a plan to commit an armed robbery of a Spokane Pizza store. The group went to the pizza store in the early morning hours and retreated when they saw there was a lot of activity in the store and nearby police presence. The group decided to order pizza to be delivered to a local address. The group agreed another co-defendant would shoot the delivery man. Mr. Paddyaker and other co-defendants were supposed to rob the victim and steal the pizzas. When the pizza delivery man arrived, one of Mr. Paddyaker's co-defendants shot him. The group looked for cash and valuables and fled the scene. Mr. Paddyaker was 17 years old at the time of the offense and he is currently 42 years of age.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a low risk to re-offend.

Mr. Paddyaker has had several serious infractions during his incarceration. He was found guilty of Sexual Assault on an Offender and there was a PREA investigation that could have resulted in an infraction but was not dealt with in a timely manner so there was no outcome to the infraction. The Board is concerned about Mr. Paddyaker's continued infraction behavior as recent as 2015.

Mr. Paddyaker has participated in a small number of offender change programs. He did complete his GED in 1999, Thinking for a Change and Roots of Success. He has served a lot of time out of state.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends that he be found not releasable under the Board's jurisdiction. Mr. Paddyaker will release on his Earned Release Date and follow the orders of his judgement and sentence.
