- Mr. Folds was seen for a .100 Hearing on August 9, 2017 at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Minimum Security Unit.
  
- **Summary Discussion**  
Jeff Patnode presented this case.

John Folds is under the Board’s jurisdiction in King County Cause 10-1-109716-0 for Manslaughter in the First Degree and Attempted Theft in the First Degree.

The crimes involved Mr. Folds sharing a hotel room with an older man while waiting for his bus after taking the same flight. The man was found in the hotel room dead from multiple stab wounds to the chest, neck and face. Years later was developed as a suspect due to DNA evidence. Mr. Folds was 18 years of age at the time of the crime and is currently 52 years of age.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a low risk to re-offend.

Mr. Folds has had one serious infraction during his incarceration for a positive UA. Mr. Folds denies that he used the substance that he tested positive for. He appealed the infraction and also requested that the UA be sent out to a lab for further testing which were both denied.

Mr. Folds was previously found conditionally parolable to a Mutual Re-entry Plan (MRP) and has transitioned to the camp setting at the Minimum Security Unit at the Monroe Correctional Complex. The Board decided to cancel the work release component of his MRP due to recent work experience in the community.

Mr. Folds would like to release to transitional housing and later to his wife. Currently she is in Section 8 housing where cannot release. He would like to work as a painter and eventually own his own painting business again.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends that he be found parolable. The Board would like him to complete three years of supervision to help with transition prior to his maximum on his sentence.

**Next action:** Submit an offender release plan (ORP).
