- An updated prosecutor recommendation was not received.

- Mr. Fletcher was seen for a .100 Hearing on December 13, 2017 at the Washington Corrections Center.

- **Summary Discussion**
Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey presented this case.

Mr. Fletcher is under the jurisdiction of the Board in Clark County 81-11188-2 for Taking a Motor Vehicle without Permission and Robbery in the First Degree.

Mr. Fletcher was also convicted of two counts of First Degree Burglary in Oregon and has 1979 convictions for Possession of a Controlled Substance, Unauthorized Use of a Motor Vehicle and Burglary and Forced Entry of a Residence.

The Robbery in the First Degree involved Mr. Fletcher robbing a convenience store attendant at knifepoint.

While on parole for the Robbery 1, Mr. Fletcher forced his way into the home of a young woman after pretending that he needed to use her phone. He threatened to kill her and then stabbed her several times.

In November of 2016, the Board continued to find him conditionally parolable to a Mutual Re-Entry Plan (MRP) and added 24 months to his minimum term to complete transition through camp and then work release. Mr. Fletcher was transferred to the Washington Corrections Center in September of 2017. He had been transferred to Cedar Creek Corrections Center as part of his MRP. While at Cedar Creek he felt threatened by other inmates and asked to be removed from camp.

Risk assessment scores rate her as a high risk to re-offend.

Mr. Fletcher has committed many serious infractions with the last one occurring in October of 2017 for refusing a directive.

Mr. Fletcher has not programmed other than reading a book about boat building so he can open his own boat building business.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends the rescinding the previous finding of conditionally parolable, that he be found not parolable, and sixty months be added to his minimum term.

Next Action: Schedule .100 hearing 120 days prior to his parole eligibility review date (PERD).
