- A prosecutor recommendation was received and does not oppose release.
- Germaine Henderson was seen for a Release Hearing on December 5, 2017 at the Monroe Correctional Complex – Twin Rivers Unit.
- **Summary Discussion**
Mr. Patnode presented this case.

Mr. Henderson is being reviewed by the Board for his convictions in King County Cause 97-1-03685-9 for Attempted Robbery in the First Degree and Murder in the First Degree, both with a firearm enhancements.

Count I involved an attempted robbery of a market at closing time by Mr. Henderson and his two crime partners. Mr. Henderson pulled out a sawed-off rifle and fired at the owner. The owner pulled out a handgun and shot Mr. Henderson in the neck. The owner called 911 and Mr. Henderson was taken to Harborview to be treated.

Count II involved Mr. Henderson and his crime partners getting into a cab to rob the driver. One of Mr. Henderson's crime partners admitted to shooting and killing the cab driver. Mr. Henderson was 16 years of age at the time of the crime and he is currently 36 years of age.

Count III was an attempted robbery that was dismissed upon entry of a guilty plea to Counts I and II. The victim was approached by a young man in a skeleton mask with a sawed off rifle. Two other youth arrived and the victim yelled to a man in the distance to call 911. The youth in the skeleton mask shot the victim in the leg as he and his crime partners were retreating.

Prior criminal history includes juvenile convictions in 1995 for Count I Assault in the Fourth Degree; and Count II Obstructing a Law Enforcement Officer. Also in 1995 was a conviction for Dangerous Weapons on School Premises. He received deferred prosecution on all three convictions and diversion was completed. Mr. Henderson also has a 1996 Residential Burglary.

Risk assessment scores rate him as a low risk to re-offend.

Mr. Henderson has had eleven infractions over the last twenty years with the last one occurring in 2007 for not complying with directives.

Mr. Henderson has participated in several offender change programs to include MICC Family Dynamics; Substance Abuse Intensive Out Patient; Re-entry Life Skills; Thinking for a Change; and Financial Peace University. He received favorable reports for his completion of these programs.

Mr. Henderson presented well and takes responsibility for the crimes he has committed.

- **Recommendation:** The panel recommends he be found releasable in June of 2019 after transition through lower levels of custody and Board approval of Offender Release Plan (ORP).

Next Action: Submit ORP in February 2019.
