LRC is in the central area of Kelso/Longview, bordering the Columbia River and Oregon. Wellestablished local businesses surround it. LRC has served the community since 1992 and was expanded in 1998. The primary goal is to improve public safety by positively changing lives, reconnecting families and providing residents with the knowledge and skills necessary for success in the community.

Residents who meet the screening criteria may be transferred to LRC 12 months before their earliest release date. The facility is operated by the Washington State Department of Corrections and provides 24/7 safety and security, food services, case management and maintenance. The Department of Corrections owns the building.
