• Violation Hearing Waiver Process – ISRB Process Decision – Draft

Ms. Getty went over the Draft Violation Hearing Waiver process.

- This form can be used to address those cases where the Board wants to address the violations, but a hearing is not warranted.
- This form can be used when the Board is holding an individual in custody pending an inpatient substance abuse treatment. If the bed date is after 45 days of the individual's arrest, the Board would need to schedule an inperson hearing or consider conditional release if the bed date closely follows the 45 days. These will be determined on a case-by-case basis.
- If the Hearing Investigator recommends a waiver, they will do so by the date the probable cause review is due for Board Member consideration.
- Between the waiver and signed Probable Cause Review sheet any conditions can be added by the Onsite Desk at the direction of the Board.

• Data on Life-time Supervision

Mrs. Ramsdell-Gilkey and Ms. Getty attended the Sex Offender Policy Board (SOPB). They asked for data around lifetime supervision.

- Data was requested and received by the Department of Corrections Data Analytics.
 - We received data around violations for individuals on supervision who have been on supervision for three, five and ten years.

• Chair's Report

- Recognition
 - Ms. Rongen recognized Ms. Fields for her work with a convicted individual and talking with him to make sure we had the correct file material.
 - Ms. Rongen recognized Ms. Schmidt for her work on the revised Decision and Reasons form. Ms. Schmidt's work and patience with the revisions on the form are appreciated.
- Staffing Due to increased staffing needs, the ISRB is getting a new Hearing Investigator III; a Program Specialist III and an Office Assistant III. These positions will be temporary until the Board requests permanent funding in the next legislative session.
- Board Members are working on training for facility staff which they hope to present this fall.
- In-Person Community Concerns Meetings Starting July 1, 2022, there will be an option for victims/survivors to meet with the Board in person for the Community Concerns Meetings. The victims/survivors must provide proof they are fully vaccinated. Ms. McNeil, Ms. Trombley and Ms. Riley will work on this process.
