

## **Progress Report & Discussion**

### I. Project Summary and Accomplishments

- <u>Key Questions</u>: How do staff select and implement interventions following Amend trainings? What impacts do interventions have?
- <u>Data collection to date</u>: Administrative data + observations (training, interventions) + **572 paper surveys** (275 staff; 213 incarcerated) + **123 interviews** (86 staff; 37 incarcerated)
- Key Sites & Interventions:
  - o Initial: SCCC Resource Team; WCCW Mobile Activity Team and Contact Officers
  - Diffusion: WSP Resource Team; MCCCW Contact Officers; Additional Interventions at all 4 sites (SCCC, WCCW, MCCCW, WSP)
- <u>Key Takeaways</u>: WA remains a role model for transparency and accessibility, developing and evaluating creative initiatives. Researchers, like staff, have worked to identify key sites and initiatives; parallel strong foundations for reform and evaluation now exist.

### Challenges:

- COVID-19 & Understaffing
- Conceptualizing different outcomes AND different processes to get there (ground-up, staff-generated)
- Everyday policies that have to be (re)adjusted to implement reforms
- Communication
  - o Who gets to participate
  - After intensive trainings and trips
  - With incarcerated individuals
  - Between institutions
  - Around competing or conflicting trainings

  - o 6-month follow-up at SCCC, WCCW + additional follow-up TBD at MCCCW, WSP
  - Administrative data and follow-up staff surveys
