### **Consolidated Siting Considerations**

- Close to services
  - Substance Abuse Treatment
  - Mental Health
  - WorkSource, Laborworks

#### Close to Transportation

- Bus lines need to connect to other buses
- Frequency of bus/transit options
- Local & regional bus options
- Walking distance to green space, proximity to parks, Outdoor space
  - Existance of sidewalks or other walkable areas
  - Proximity to schools, single family residential area



#### Consolidated Siting Considerations Cont.

- Shopping
  - Clothing, Hygiene, Food, pharmacies
- Building Security
  - Security Lighting, methods to control movement

#### Building Requirements

- Meeting spaces/classroom areas for programming/presentations to residents, etc.
- Parking (for staff and visitors)
- Traffic
- Backup systems for interruption such as power, water, gas, etc.
- Resource room with computers, High speed internet (for communication, job searches, online application access, and other web-based services)
- Storage for extra supplies (mattresses, linen, etc.), Secure resident property/evidence, Staff property
- Exercise/fitness options
- Other
  - Minimize NIMBY issues



#### Site Review/Assessment update

- 3 properties in the Auburn area. These will probably require a "Conditional Use Permit" and we are currently researching requirements
- Location walk thru visits are very difficult right now and will be conducted as we are allowed access

#### **Communication plan considerations:**

Franklyn Smith designated as lead on LAC Communication Plan. James Koroma will assist

- Inform the public that a Work Release facility actually reduces recidivism
- Need to address what type of participants will be residing at the Work Release (public will ask)
- NIMBY issues
- Allow community to be part of the messaging. Don't want to give the impression that we are operating in our own silo.
- Let the public know that Work Release participants are returning to this county because that is where their connections and support systems are
