Getting Started	Preparation Notes/File Information
<p><b>Introducing the Interview:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We're going to talk about your life before you were arrested. It helps us understand where you are coming from.</li> <li>Everyone does this type of interview when they come to prison or are placed on supervision.</li> <li>I have some things to talk to you about that are intended to help both of us understand you better. You just need to answer to the best of your ability.</li> </ul> <p><b>Starting the Interview:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Thinking back to a couple months before your arrest, tell me about a typical day starting from the moment you woke up.</li> <li>Tell me a little bit about your life before you were arrested.</li> <li>Let's start by talking about what led you to be in prison/on supervision.</li> </ul> <p><b>Helpful Hints:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use plain talk: have a conversation free from acronyms, etc.</li> <li>Be neutral: look to find information without judgment</li> <li>Avoid questions that imply a correct answer, such as <i>you didn't threaten anyone, right?</i></li> <li>Stay on topic: keep conversation around information you're looking for</li> <li>Take breaks as needed. Interviews may be difficult for the interviewer or the interviewee.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Residential:</b></p>
