- Mr. Dalager was seen for a release hearing at the Stafford Creek Corrections Center on August 11, 2020.

- **Summary Discussion**

Mr. Patnode presented the case to the full Board

Mr. Dalager is being seen by the Board in Stevens County Cause #99-1-00145-6 for Murder in the First Degree.

The crime involved Mr. Dalager and two of his friends killing a peer age male. The plan was to rob the victim. Mr. Dalager was 17 years old at the time of the crime and is currently 38 years of age.

Mr. Dalager has no other known criminal history.

Risk assessments show Mr. Dalager to be a low to moderate risk to re-offend.

Mr. Dalager's last infraction was in 2011 and he has had five total infractions over his incarceration.

Mr. Dalager is employed full time and recently completed the Redemption Program. He has an AA Degree.

Mr. Dalager has transportation, housing and employment opportunities in Spokane.

- **Decision:**

The panel recommends Mr. Dalager be found releasable.

- **Reasons:**

- **Mr. Dalager has completed the necessary programs to mitigate his risk to the community and demonstrated he can appropriately manage his behavior.**
- **He has received numerous favorable reports regarding his participation in treatment, education, and vocational programming.**
- **Mr. Dalager has good community support and a detailed realistic release plan that includes housing and employment as well as donated treatment services and mentors.**
- **Mr. Dalager most recent psychological evaluation completed by Dr. Robtoy, February 27, 2020, assesses him as overall risk including protective factors to be in the low moderate range. Dr. Robtoy further indicates that "he may be a reasonable candidate for reduction in custody level and/or release to the community".**
- **Mr. Dalager will have 36 months of community supervision.**

- **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

As indicated in his psychological evaluation, Mr. Dalager should remain free from substance use and participate in any available group treatment that would assist in his transition to the community after spending his adult life to date in prison.

- **Next Action:**

- Submit an offender release plan (ORP).
