1,610 incarcerated individuals work at CI as of 6/30/22.


CI incarcerated participants worked a total of **218,335** programming hours.

155 employment based certifications issued to CI incarcerated participants.

CI contributed **\$46.2M** to the Washington State economy through purchases from local suppliers and staff salaries.

\$1,097,546



FISCAL YEAR COMPARISON - 5 YEARS


