



NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW

RCW 9.94A.7606 (1) allows the Department of Corrections to issue any person or entity an Order to Withhold and Deliver property of any kind, including, but not restricted to, earnings that are due, owing, or belonging to a supervised individual, if the Department has reason to believe that there is, in the possession of such person or entity, property that is due, owing, or belonging to the individual.

An Order to Withhold and Deliver can be issued any time a monthly court ordered legal financial obligation payment is not paid when due, and an amount equal to or greater than the amount payable for one month is owed. A copy of the Order to Withhold and Deliver is to be mailed to the individual by any form of mail requiring a return receipt, or, in the alternative, a copy of the Order shall be personally served on the individual on or before the date of the service of the Order or within two days thereafter.

The individual has the right to petition the court for judicial review of the issuance of the Order to Withhold and Deliver. If any irregularity appears in the mailing or service of the Order, the court may set aside the Order to Withhold and Deliver if the individual can demonstrate through an affidavit that they have suffered substantial injury due to the Department's failure to mail or serve the individual's copy.
