ABOUT THE FACILITY

Custody Level:

- Maximum, Close, and Medium

Population:

- 677 current capacity, 900 total capacity
 - Has the capacity to house 415 close custody, 200 medium custody, and 62 maximum custody

Clallam Bay Corrections Center (CBCC) is the second largest employer in Clallam County. It opened in 1985 as a 450-bed medium custody facility, costing \$56 million. CBCC converted to close custody in 1991 and added a 400-bed medium custody building.

In October 2021, CBCC (warm) closed the 400-bed medium custody building, reducing the capacity to 502. This was a result of both the Blake Decision and the reduction in court sentencing statewide due to COVID-19. As sentencing increased statewide, CBCC has reopened 200 medium custody beds and looks to reopen 200 more medium beds and 130 close custody beds.

PROGRAMMING

CBCC partners with Peninsula College to provide college level classes. Peninsula College will begin implementation of the IBEST programs in corrections; integrating basic skills and vocational programming in corrections.

Other Programs Include:

- Peninsula College offers Basic Skills, Highschool Plus, Certificates in Computer Programming and Mobile Game Design, Business Administration, Facilities Maintenance, and Pastry and Specialty Baking.
- Substance Abuse IOP Treatment, Offender Enrichment, Cognitive Behavioral, Family Centered and Mental Health classes
- Vocational work programs, including Food Service, Electricians, Groundkeepers, Mechanics, Welder and Plumbing apprentice programs, CI Laundry and Recreation
- Sustainability programs:
 - Outdoor gardens and a greenhouse that provide freshly grown produce for use in CBCC's food kitchen and for donations to local food banks
 - The bee program offers advanced training and certification in beekeeping and apiary management. To date, CBCC has four hives and has awarded 24 beginner certificates

Partnerships:

- CBCC has MOUs for a variety of services, including with the Clallam County Sheriff's Department, Clallam County Fire District #5, Neah Bay Department of Safety, Washington State Patrol and the US Coast Guard
- CBCC has four active special teams and is involved with three others statewide

FACILITY & CAPITAL PROJECTS

CBCC has completed projects that have reduced usage of finite resources.

Recent Facility Projects:

- Replaced diesel boilers and dryers with propane, replaced lighting with LEDs, added electronically-controlled water valves to reduce water consumption, HVAC improvements, new water pumps and more (\$17 million)
- Warehouse roof replacement, including the addition of a high insulation factor to help reduce our carbon footprint (\$800k)
- Upgrading Emergency Fire Pump Generators from diesel fuel to electric to help reduce our carbon footprint (\$1.4 million)
- Partnership program with Welfare for Animals Guild (WAG) for both cat and dog rehabilitation with incarcerated caretakers.
