Cedar Creek Corrections Center (CCCC) opened in 1954. The facility has a 479-bed capacity. The staff at CCCC recognize that the culture and success of the community begins with them. These correctional professionals work with a dedication to continuous improvement and a safe environment for the public, the incarcerated population and themselves.

CCCC partners with local schools, businesses and churches to collaborate on several community projects each year. Through their own fundraising events and with the assistance of staff, incarcerated individuals have donated to "Roof Community Service," St. Jude's Hospital, Littlerock Elementary School and the Boys & Girls Club. Additionally, staff have held food drives for local food banks, supported local non-profits such as the Rochester "ROOF program and adopt-a-family during the holidays.

PROGRAMMING

CCCC provides on-the-job training to incarcerated individuals, enabling them to develop marketable job skills and increase their chances of successful reentry.

Work Programs Include:

- Construction Trades Apprenticeship Preparation, a 20-credit program providing a pathway to highwage/high-demand employment in one of four trade unions (Carpenters, Cement Mason, Ironworkers and Laborers)
- Drywall, Siding and Roofing Certificates
- DNR employment for forestry-related public projects around the state, including fire suppression
- Correctional Industries training includes warehouse and laundry management, business record keeping, furniture installation and land stewardship
- Welding, electrical, general building maintenance, and wastewater treatment plant operator through CCCC's Maintenance Department
- Food Service, Unit/Building Janitor, Recreation Worker, Groundskeeping, Laundry, Community Work Crew
