RRC is a six-story building constructed as a hotel in the early 1900s. It was converted into a reentry center facility in 1978. It is centrally located in downtown Seattle, with ample public transportation options. The primary goal is improving public safety by positively changing lives and reconnecting families by providing residents with the knowledge and skills necessary for success in the community.

Residents who meet the screening criteria may be transferred to RRC 12 months before their earliest release date. The facility is operated by the Washington State Department of Corrections and provides 24/7 safety and security, food services, case management and maintenance. The building is leased.
