Current Status

Corrections continues to ensure the safe transition of incarcerated individuals to lower levels of
custody and will begin safely <u>resuming transfers to work release facilities</u> beginning in January
2021. Transfers will be limited to those facilities with available capacity and beds will be filled as
they become open through releases.

Topics of Interest

Medical Isolation is not a punitive measure nor is it the same as what members of the public refer to as "solitary confinement." It is a measure taken to protect the health and safety of all incarcerated individuals and to mitigate and stop the spread of COVID-19. Incarcerated individuals are allowed to bring their personal belongings with them to medical isolation. Incarcerated individuals in medical isolation areas are provided opportunities to call their friends and family. Individuals on medical isolation are seen by mental health providers per the WA State DOC COVID-19 Mental Health/Psychiatry Response Guideline. These steps, and others, are taken to ensure that those on medical isolation are both physically and mentally cared for by health services staff, and also continue to have connections with their friends and family.

Prison Facilities

Airway Heights Corrections Center (AHCC)

- Number of new cases in last 30 days: 896
- Number of confirmed cases to date: 1,438
- As the recovery rates increase, incarcerated individuals are being cleared to return to work.
- The food factory will be working additional hours in January to bring production back to normal.
- L-unit, M-unit, and R-unit B-tier were released from medical isolation status.

Larch Correction Center (LCC)

Monroe Correctional Complex (MCC)

Stafford Creek Corrections Center (SCCC)

- Number of new cases in last 30 days: 772

- Recovered COVID-19 incarcerated individuals moved out of the alternate housing areas in the P building and visit room yesterday.
- Laundry, commissary, and food services are operating with limited crews. Laundry and garbage pickup are both working seven (7) days a week. The facility continues to identify recovered individuals who are able to return to work.
