Current Status

- In the last 7 days:
 - There have been eight (8) new staff cases.
 - Active cases in the incarcerated population decreased from 57 to 30.
 - o The number of active cases at MCC decreased from 134 to 56.
 - The number of active cases at SCCC decreased from 58 to 37.
 - There were no new positive cases at MCC and one (1) new case at SCCC.
 - There were two (2) new positive cases at Ahtanum View Work Release and six (6) new cases at Helen B Ratcliff Work Release.

Per policy 450.100 Mail for Individuals in Prison, "electronic messages will be distributed to an
incarcerated individual within seven business days" excluding emergency situations. As of close
of business on Friday, March 5, 2021, the longest standing, undelivered electronic message was
dated February 28, 2021 for a total of five (5) business days. All prison facilities were within the
policy guidelines.
