Food Trays – CPM Schreiber was asked about the incarcerated individual’s food trays not being properly sanitized. We use the 3 sink system. The water is continuously changed out to ensure the proper temp is maintained. Below is a link that explains it.

Staff Screening – At the start each shift, staff is being screened before be allowed into the facility. This includes taking temperatures and asking a series of questions regarding COVID 19 symptoms.

Antibacterial Soap – The antibacterial soap from headquarters was handed out to all units. H6 was handed out this store on 4/1/20.

Rumors –

‘One unit had a positive case’ – Health Service Manager Parris states there has not been any positive test results at SCCC.

‘Airway Heights is closed down’ – no, AHCC is not closed down.

JPay – Thank you, the free calls and free video visits are very much appreciated. How many free calls will there be? **Denise Myers sent an email to JPay and let them know of the expressed appreciation and asked how many and how long the free calls will last. When information is sent back it will be shared with you.

Tier Rep Meetings – daily Tier Rep Meetings is a good idea and appreciated.

Kudos – Coyote Ridge Correctional Industries for making protective gowns for health care workers. The CI here at SCCC will soon begin to make masks for health care workers.

Isolation Cells – Each cell has a TV. If the incarcerated individual has a player, staff will bring it to them.

Lunches – Sack lunches were given out, but SCCC will now be distributing boat lunches. Hot meals will be given for breakfast and dinner.

Phone Dividers – SCCC will not be putting up plastic dividers between the phones. However, CPM Schreiber will follow up on this issue.

Mattresses – the new mattress program is going well, one incarcerated individual has said it was a ‘life changer’. SCCC is working with WCC for a different outer coating for the mattresses.
