Other notable and non-related issues:

- Laundry issues have been resolved. We are still putting messages out there to the population about working for CI in the laundry but have not got a lot of response. Laundry is still being done twice a week. We checked with HQ and at this time due to expenses we are unable to give more than 5 pairs of underwear to each incarcerated individual.
- Notes on the JPay project per meeting discussion:
 - *Project to update current JPay/Aventiv wireless backbone infrastructure to current Aventiv accepted standards concerning Rocket and Nano access points and Air-Fiber bridges for all locations. The expected work is to replace Generation 1 Rocket and Nano access points with Generation 2 units supplied by Aventiv, replace the existing Rocket antenna where needed with supplied replacements, and replace any existing AirFiber unit not of current model standard of "UBIQUITI AIR FIBER 5, SHI AF-5 US" or current Aventiv standard at the time of execution as supplied by Aventiv. In addition, several sites will receive Fortinet switch upgrades in their head ends to accommodate the increased bandwidths.*
 - This was verified with Jake Campbell, Engineering Supervisor at WSP.

- We had a meeting today with Ms. Cotton to discuss the “Safe Start Visitation” schedule. We are looking at the possibility of opening visits up as early as the end of November.
- We have looked into the gym situation. When this all began, Governor Inslee said that all gyms, statewide were to be closed and because we never received an update from HQ, we haven’t made the changes. After speaking with Jeneva, she approved us to open. We are planning this in one to two weeks due to the recreation staff being temporarily laid off at this time.
 - Non-represented staff had to take furlough days; 4 in July, 1 in August, 1 in September, 1 in October and 1 in November.
 - Represented staff are now having to take 4 temp lay off days in the month of October and 3 in the month of November.
- The Superintendent has approved the COVID meeting notes to be put out as an announcement for the population. We will send the notes to the Superintendent’s AA3 to put out with the announcements and once this week’s notes are approved, they will also be put out for the population.
- Notes are now online through September 22, 2020.
- A member heard that Unit 6 has not been able to get yard. Steve was in the East Complex today and saw Unit 6 was having yard. Each unit is moving in co-horts (with their own unit). Unit 6 is able to have yard with Unit 6.
- It was suggested by the committee members that the COVID meetings be held every other week rather than once a week. If there is a break out or something happens Carrie will send out an announcement and we will discuss changing the meetings back to once a week. For now, there seems to be very few updates.
 - **The next meeting will tentatively be on October 27th unless it is decided to connect it to the October 28th LFC meeting.**
